


KEEPING the Beat



Foundation prioritizing upgrade for Surgical Services Department

This year, one of Delta Hospital and Community Health Foundation's priorities is to upgrade and refresh the equipment needs of our busy Surgical Services Department.

Delta Hospital's Day Surgery Program includes three operating rooms, six post-anesthetic care bays, 13 pre and post-operation care beds in surgical daycare and a dedicated endoscopy procedure room.

It is one of the busiest day surgery sites in the Fraser Health region, with an average of 7,900 surgeries and endoscopies being performed each year.

"State-of-the-art equipment at Delta Hospital is essential for patient care. We see large changes that occur with the technology every 3-5 years," says Dr. Dan Robibo, General Surgeon & Department Head of Surgery, Delta Hospital. "Having more sophisticated equipment enables us to diagnose disease as early as possible and treat it as effectively as possible with the most modern equipment that we have available. This shortens recovery time for patients and ensures that they have best possible outcomes."

As Delta's population grows and

ages, it becomes even more important that our hospital has access to the very best equipment. Since 2001, Delta's senior population has more than doubled in size and this trend continues for the foreseeable future.

By providing a wide range of day surgeries here in Delta, we are helping to ensure that patients don't have to travel to other hospitals, where they'd often be placed on long wait lists. Here, patients are close to home, and close to their families which improves their experience and ultimately strengthens our

Delta's new Echo Ultrasound has now performed over 1,666 scans



Echocardiography Services are now available at the Peter C. and Elizabeth Toigo Diagnostic Services Building inside Delta Hospital thanks to the new, state-of-the-art Echo Ultrasound. This incredible stateof-the-art piece of equipment has transformed cardiac care at the Delta Hospital Campus of Care. The Echo produces 2D and 4D images of the heart to assess cardiac function and faster, often lifesaving diagnoses for patients in cardiac distress.

Funded by Delta Hospital and Community Health Foundation, the Echo Ultrasound has now performed over 1,666 scans since the start of service in August 2021.

Accessing echocardiography services close to home is increasingly important as Delta's population ages. Previously, all Delta Hospital inpatients and outpatients in the community needed to travel to other sites to have access to this diagnostic tool resulting in delayed patient care, additional transport costs, and the requirement to provide nurse escorts.

"We are so proud to play a role in bringing this new service to Delta Hospital and we are incredibly appreciative to our donors for supporting the Echo Ultrasound campaign," says Lisa Hoglund, Executive Director, Delta Hospital and Community Health Foundation. "This brand-new service is operating in the Peter C. and Elizabeth Toigo Diagnostic Services Building, ensuring our community has access to the latest and best technology possible. This would not be possible without the continued support of our community."
