## Ryan and Cindy Beedie Donate \$5M to DHCH Foundation in Support of a New Long Term Care Community



Ryan and Cindy Beedie have donated a record \$5 million to Delta Hospital and Community Health Foundation (DHCH Foundation) in support of their 'Coming Home' campaign. This is the largest, single gift received toward DHCH Foundation's \$18.25 million campaign for a new long term care community at the Delta Hospital Campus of Care. In recognition, the new 200-bed facility at

the Delta Hospital Campus of Care will be named the Beedie Long-Term Care Centre. Replacing the current 92-bed Mountain View Manor, the Centre will offer a home-like environment with communal spaces and outdoor access. The project also includes a 32-space adult day program and a 49-space child daycare, encouraging intergenerational connections. Owned and operated by Fraser Health, the facility is designed with lessons from the pandemic in mind, incorporating best practices in infection control and cultural sensitivity. The Beedies, through their foundation, are dedicated to improving healthcare, education, and opportunities for vulnerable populations both locally and globally. Their extraordinary generosity marks a milestone in transforming long term care in Delta.

## Foundation Reaches \$18.25M Fundraising Milestone in Record Time!

Delta Hospital and Community Health Foundation has reached an exciting milestone of raising \$18.25 million for the new Beedie Long-Term Care Centre! This achievement was made possible by our generous community, including a record \$5M gift from Ryan & Cindy Beedie and \$3M from the Delta Hospital Auxiliary Society. Construction is now underway, starting with site preparation and paving. Next steps will be the arrival of preload this fall.

# The Delta Hospital Auxiliary Society Donates \$3M to DHCH Foundation in Support of a New Long Term Care Community



The Delta Hospital Auxiliary Society (DHAS) has made a record donation of \$3M to the Delta Hospital and Community Health Foundation's 'Coming Home' Campaign. This exceptional donation toward DHCH Foundation's \$18.25 million campaign for a new Long Term Care community, is

one of the largest gifts ever received from a hospital auxiliary in the province. The DHAS has been providing volunteer services, patient care and comfort and funding from their entrepreneurial efforts to Delta Hospital since 1969. As one of B.C.'s most successful hospital auxiliaries, the DHAS has over 300 dedicated volunteers who donate nearly 60,000 hours each year, working at the Auxiliary's businesses - Dogwood Gift Shop, Courtyard Café, the Delta Auxiliary Thrift Store and Lifeline.

The new 200 bed Long Term Care Centre, owned and operated by Fraser Health Authority, will replace the 92 beds at Delta Hospital's current facility, Mountain View Manor. The new facility will be named Beedie Long Term Care Centre and will include social and recreational spaces found in a typical home, such as a living room, dining room, activity space and access to the outdoors. In addition, the project will add a 32-space adult day program. An innovative stand-alone 49-space child daycare facility will also be constructed and create opportunities for intergenerational programming with long term care residents.
